- 19. Shaul told Yonatan and his servants that he wanted "to kill Dovid." ('x)
- **9.** Yehonatan told his father "The king should not sin" with his servant Dovid. ('7)
- **17.** Yonatan told Shaul that all of Dovid's actions are "very good for you." ('7)
- **16.** When Dovid went to battle against the Plishtim, they did this. ('\bar{n})
- **8.** When Shaul threw a spear at Dovid it landed here. ('')
- **12.** Dovid made his escape when Michal lowered him out through this. (כִּ"כִי)
- **5.** Michal put this in Dovid's bed so it should look like he was still there. (λ''')
- **13.** Shaul didn't care that Dovid was sick and told his messengers to bring Dovid to him even if he is in this. (ງ"ט)
- 1. Shaul asked Michal "Why did you fool me like this?" ('"')

- 11. Yonatan questioned why his father would want to sin "with innocent blood" by killing Dovid for nothing? ('7)
- **3.** Michal warned Dovid that if he doesn't escape that night he would be dead by this time. (\aleph'')
- **10.** According to Michal, Dovid was unable to come with the servants of Shaul because of this reason. (7",)
- **14.** According to Michal, Dovid told her to help him escape for "Why should I kill you?" (†"')
- 7. A phrase that is repeated three times and describes what happened to each of the three groups of messengers that Shaul sent to get Dovid from Ramah. (כ'-כ"א)
- **6.** A question Shaul asked the people when he reached Sehchu. (כ"ב)
- 13. Shaul took this off once he began to prophesize. (כ"ד)
- **2.** When people realized Shaul had prophesized for an extended period of time they began to use this phrase (for whenever a person attainted an unexpected position of greatness). (7")
